Objectives

The SRP MSc Programme provides advanced training to students in the study of religion in plural societies within an inter-religious and comparative framework while allowing students to focus on a specific religious tradition.

Using case studies and scenarios, the programme will equip students with the theories, skills, methods and tools relevant to inter-religious leadership, conflict resolution, peace-building, dialogue, as well as the design and implementation of research projects.

- recognize personal subjectivities in the study of religion and engagement with religious communities.
- demonstrate familiarity with the multi-disciplinary approaches in the study of religion.
- demonstrate understanding of contemporary debates in inter-religious studies.
- able to anticipate problems between religious communities and disruptive trends to social harmony and apply the necessary tools to manage them.
- apply the skills and tools relevant to leadership, management, peace-building, conflict resolution and networking to facilitate active and peaceful engagement between religious communities.
- design research projects, evaluate, synthesize relevant literature and communicate results in a scholarly manner.


