## **Religious Conflicts**

#### 1. Two suicide bombers kill 22 at mosque in northeast Nigeria's Maiduguri

22 people were killed and a further 18 injured when two female suicide bombers detonated their bombs at a mosque in Maiduguri during morning prayers. Although no group has claimed responsibility for the attack yet, the modus operandi of the attack is characteristic of the Boko Haram which has been using female suicide bombers in its attempt to carve out an Islamic state in the region.

#### 2. Five held after two Muslim cowherds hanged to death in India

Two Muslim Cowherds were hanged to death by suspected Hindu radicals in India's Jharkhand state, sparking violent protests. Opponents of the Bharatiya Janata Party have accused them of stoking religious tensions to polarise voters in view of the upcoming state assembly elections, and not doing enough to protect the religious minorities engaged in cowherding.

#### 3. Brussels attacks: Zaventem and Maelbeek bombs kill many
