## NATURAL DISASTERS IN ASIA AND THE PACIFIC

In 2015, the Asia-Pacific continues to be the world's most disaster prone region. 160 disasters were reported in the region, accounting for 47% of the world's 344 disasters.

were the most frequent disaster; floods and storms were the costliest in terms of economic loss




### **SOUTH AND SOUTH-WEST ASIA**

was the most affected subregion


# 2015 ASIA-PACIFIC LOSSES BY DISASTER TYPE















Around half of the 90 storms recorded globally were in the Asia-Pacific, affecting over 9 million people with US\$ 11.8 billion in economic damage.

Floods were the most frequent disaster in 2015, comprising two-fifths of all disasters, affecting over 2 billion people with US\$11.5 billion economic damage.
