

CENS Workshop on Cybercrime: The Hidden World

Synopsis

The Workshop on Cybercrime will be held from 13 to 14 November 2017 in Singapore. This intensive one-and-half-day workshop aims to provide a deep understanding into the different dimensions of cybercrime, including the investigation of crime on the dark web. The workshop aims to provide perspectives from the fields of law enforcement, the cybersecurity industry, academia, and international organisations.

Leading experts (made up of a combination of local and international speakers) include **Thomas Dougherty** (US Department of Justice Legal Advisor for Cybercrime in Asia, US Embassy Kuala Lumpur), **Graham Pease** (ARGOS, Child Abuse and Sexual Crime Group, Queensland Police Service), **K. Jaishankar** (Department of Criminology, Raksha Shakti University (Police and Internal Security University), India), **Vitaly Kamluk** (Global Research & Analysis Team, APAC, Kaspersky Lab) and **Vicky Ray** (Unit42 – Threat Intelligence, Palo Alto Networks)

Panels

1. **Cybercrime and the Dark Web** – how cybercrime investigations are done on the dark web; and, how to catch cybercriminals.
2. **Psychology of Cybercrime** – the psychology of ransomware; the psychology of the victim in cyberspace; and, forensically analysing behaviour of cybercriminals.
3. **Global Cybercrime** – how global cooperation is needed for cybercrime; the use of mutual legal assistance in fighting cybercrime; and, the global trends in cybercrimes.
4. **Case Studies in Cybercrime** – Case studies on Forensics; cybercrime networks; and cybercrime cases in other jurisdictions.
