In 2020, there were 280.6 million migrants in the world, 23.58 million of whom are from Southeast Asia (including Timor Leste). Of the 10.6 million number of international migrants living and working in Southeast Asia, 7.09 million of migrants are from the region.

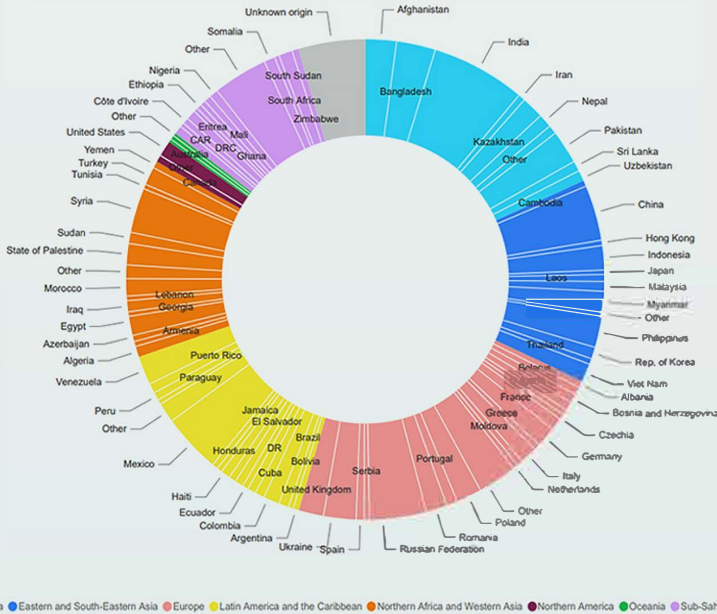
Proportionate distribution of international migrants, by region and country or area of destination, 2020

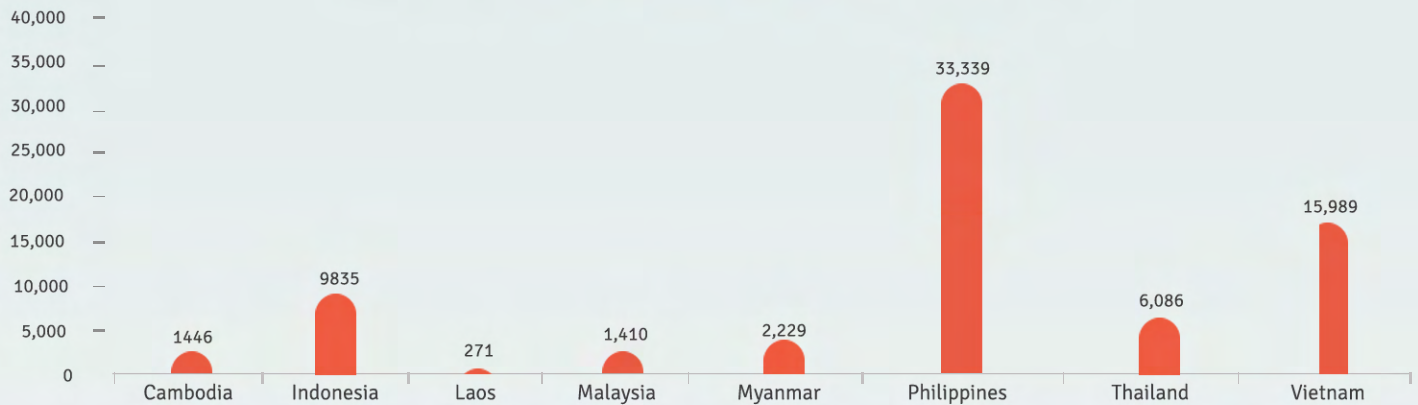

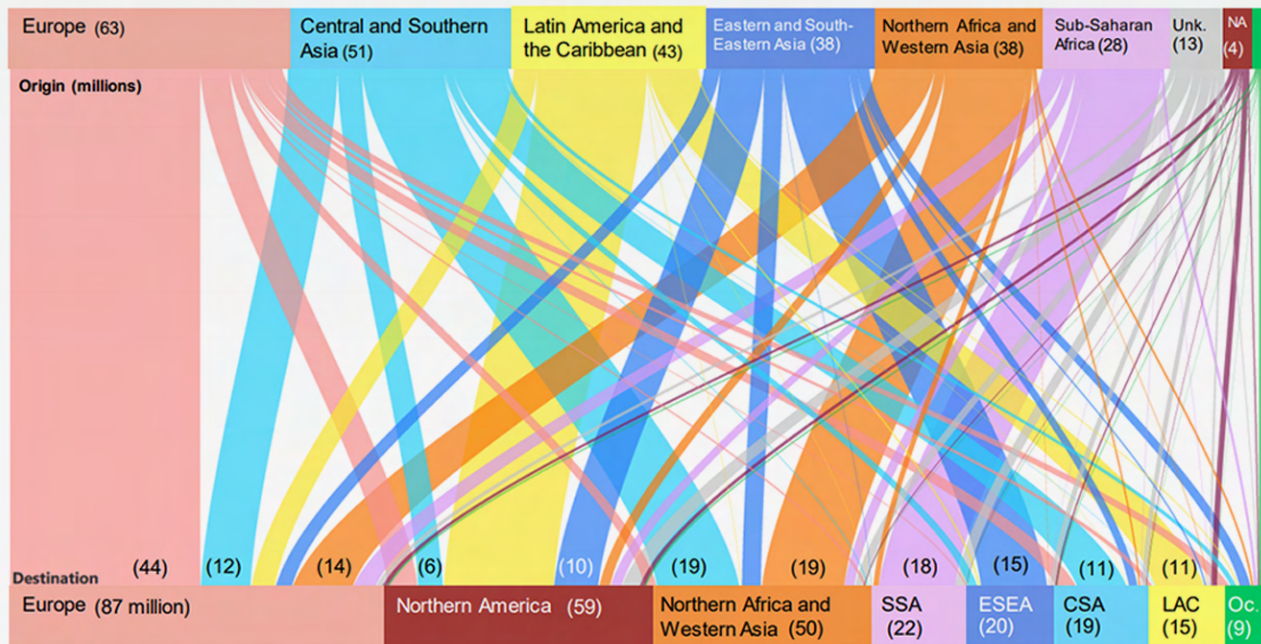
## ESTIMATE OF REMITTANCE INFLOWS (MILLIONS OF US\$)
