

### **Mobility Restrictions**


It has been estimated that the number of international migrants for 2020 was lower – by approximately 2 million – than it would have been in the absence of COVID-19. With international mobility restrictions slowly easing in some parts of the world, it is likely that the growth of international migrants may increase, although at nowhere near pre-pandemic levels.

As of 21st February 2022, 92% of countries, territories and areas had some form of entry conditions or restrictions at their various entry points (air, land, sea).

### Remittances

While all countries in Southeast Asia other than Vietnam seemed to have experienced a drop in remittances compared to previous years, this decrease seems relatively minimal.<sup>1</sup> Total global international remittances declined from approximately 719.4 billion USD in 2019 to 701.9 billion USD in 2020, likely due to COVID-19. <sup>2</sup> While not insignificant, the actual decline (2.4%) was much less than initially projected (20%). <sup>3</sup>
