

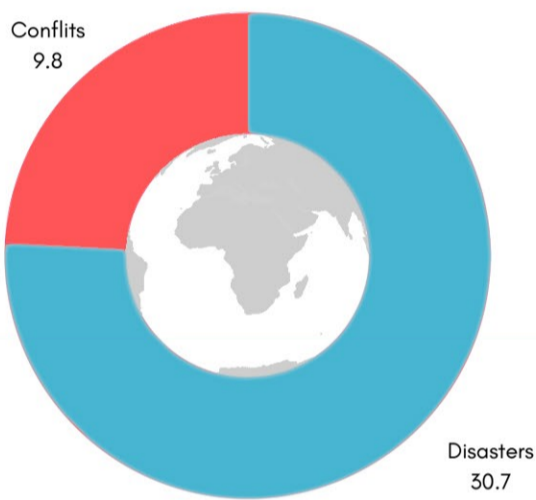
GROWING CLIMATE-INDUCED HUMANITARIAN NEEDS

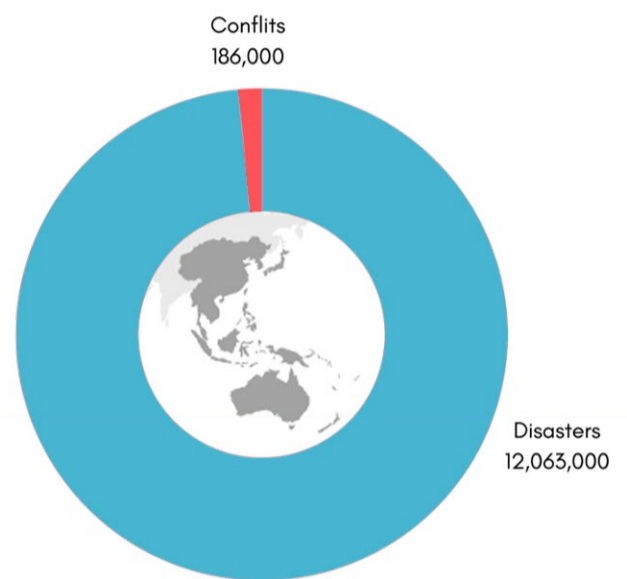
Natural hazards and extreme weather events displace more people than conflicts.

In 2020, disasters associated with natural hazards and extreme weather events led to 30.7 million of new displacements, significantly higher than 9.8 million caused by conflicts. The impact of climate change on humanitarian needs is most obvious, where 12 million people were displaced by disasters and 186,000 by conflicts. Tropical storms and floods were primary cause of displacement in the region. In Southeast Asia, three countries were among the ten countries with the most new displacements by disasters in 2020, including the Philippines, Vietnam and Indonesia.

New Displacements in Southeast Asia in 2020
